RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

This full report is available at mplsgop.org, it will be displayed on the main convention screen, and there are a limited number of paper copies available upon request at the registration table.

The resolutions committee received 22 distinct resolutions from MRP precinct caucuses. These resolutions seek to change the state party platform (see mplsgop.org) or advocate for specific legislation or policy. All 22 resolutions are included in this report, with the committee's recommendation to adopt or not adopt each one.

There is a long path remaining for these resolutions: Those that are adopted by this convention will be submitted to CD5, and those that survive the CD5 platform/resolutions committee report will be voted on by the CD5 convention. Those resolutions adopted by that convention will be submitted to state, and those that survive the state platform committee report will be voted on by the state convention. Those that are adopted by the state convention will become part of the state party platform and action agenda.

The party platform houses enduring party principles. The action agenda, a newer creation, houses commitments to advocate for specific legislation or policy. While the state resolutions committee may recommend that certain platform items sunset, that is, automatically expire after a certain number of years, the entire action agenda expires and is re-made every two years.

In this report, the resolutions are presented under the platform section, or plank, that they pertain to. The following are provided: the statement of principle of that plank, the committee's determination of whether the resolution belongs to the platform or the action agenda, the number of precincts that submitted the resolution, the committee's recommendation to adopt the resolution or not, the reason for some of the recommendations not to adopt the resolution, the text of the resolution, and some quotations from the current platform related to the resolution. There is a summary table on the next page.

The committee also notes the following regarding the process for adopting these resolutions:

- According to convention rule 12A, if a delegate or seated alternate disagrees with the committee's recommendation, he
 or she may move to separate that resolution out for its own debate and vote; the remainder of the report will be voted
 on by a single vote, without debate, to adopt all of and only those items the committee recommended for adoption.
- According to convention rule 12B, only resolutions reported out of the Resolutions Committee may be considered by the Convention.

WHEREAS: The role of the executive branch is to implement and uphold our law, and is expressly denied the ability to assume law-making powers by Article III of the Minnesota Constitution

WHEREAS: An emergency can only be labeled as such if it has begun and ended with urgency, and while a governor has the right to act in times of crisis, he was never given the authority of indefinite extension of these powers

WHEREAS: The worst regimes of the twentieth century used emergency powers as a trojan horse to introduce despotism, communism, and ideologies of inconceivable horror

WHEREAS: We have the option now of ceasing this precedent of emergency power abuse before it becomes the new standard, and our legislature is relegated to a position beneath the other branches

Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Republican party demands that the Minnesota Legislature pass the Never Again bill immediately, regardless of opposition stemming from radically corrupted politicians:

The reason we need to put this essential check on the executive branch:

- Governor Walz enforced the unconstitutional cessation of burials, baptisms, weddings, and other religious services expressly
 protected in the First Amendment
- We have no guarantee that Governor Walz or other Governors in the future won't likewise refute our God-given rights
- Any allowance of unconstitutional behavior creates room for indefinite breaches of our liberties in the future
- The state of Minnesota and its residents suffered untold economic and developmental damage from the mismanagement of a power-hungry, willfully-negligent, and overextended Governor
- An unchecked loss of liberty now would embolden those that desire to trounce on our freedom for political, financial, or personal gain
- The greater the power delegated to an executive, the greater their ability to abuse these powers or enhance our suffering in proportion to their shortcomings

This position is supported for the following reasons.

- The majority of people no longer trust the elections and the reported results.
- Control for election processes and reporting has shifted to higher levels of government or to Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)which are not subject to Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests.
- Currently most election contests are not validated after the election with the State mandated PER.
- We The People not only have the right to vote, but we also have the right to understand, observe, and participate in the process
 of counting votes and validating vote counts reported.
- These changes will make elections more secure, transparent, and trustworthy for and to the public.
- These measures provide local control and management to more closely ensure integrity in process and execution.

Resolution:

We oppose electronic and NGO (Non-Government Organization) involvement in election processes and reporting. We support locally stored Election Judges' personal data; we do not support NGO access to Election Judges' personal data. We support paper ballots to hand-mark selections on the ballot. We support hand-counting of votes for all races that involve more than one candidate and on all referendums on the ballots. We support paper-only poll books. We do not support electronic tabulators or electronic poll pads.

This position is supported for the following reasons.

- The majority of people do not trust the elections and their reported results.
- There is a growing trend to turn control of election processes and reporting over to organizations that are outside of government. These Non-Government Organizations (NGO's) are not subject to Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests.
- The current process includes external electronic communication access to the precinct elections by way of the Electronic poll pads and Electronic Tabulators. All external electronic communication to the precinct needs to be eliminated.
- We The People not only have the right to vote, but we also have the right to understand, observe, and participate in the process
 of counting votes and validating vote counts reported.
- These changes will make elections more secure, transparent, and trustworthy for and to the public.
- These measures ensure local control and management to more closely ensure integrity in process and execution.

What's in the platform now:

9 - Make Government Smaller and Better

We support keeping government functions in state, local or private hands, electing honest and responsive legislative bodies, advocating for fair election processes, and generally making government smaller and better.

We must improve polling place procedures, specifically voter registration practices.

We support prohibiting local governments from accepting or using any non-governmental, third-party, or private money, grants, or gifts from outside sources to assist in the administration of an election.
